WHEREAS, mental illnesses and substance use disorders are treatable, and recovery is possible when appropriate treatment services are available and accessible; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of the City of Black Hawk may be affected by mental illness regardless of age, gender, race, ethnicity, religion, or economic status, and

WHEREAS, the City of Black Hawk is dedicated to improving the health and wellbeing of its citizens by ending stigma and focusing on the integrated role of mental health in all our lives,

THEREFORE, I, David D. Spellman, Mayor of the City of Black Hawk, do hereby proclaim
