TITLE: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 13-3 OF THE BLACK HAWK MUNICIPAL CODE TO REQUIRE ALL CITY WATER CUSTOMERS TO HAVE SEWER SERVICE FROM THE BLACK HAWK – CENTRAL CITY SANITATION DISTRICT

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK HAWK, GILPIN COUNTY:

Section 1. Section 13-3 of the Black Hawk Municipal Code, subsection (a), is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 13-3. - Requiring hookup to municipal system.

(a) All occupied buildings located within the municipal limits of the City shall be required to connect to the City's water system, and all City water customers shall connect to the Black Hawk-Central City Sanitation District for sewer service, unless such water service is solely for fire suppression, and sewer service is not required pursuant to the City's adopted building codes. All new connections to the City's water system must also install a backflow prevention device, surge arrestor and a water meter. All connections to the City's water system and the installation of backflow prevention devices, surge arrestors and water meters shall be in accordance with the Water Board's rules and regulations.

Section 2. Safety Clause. The City Council hereby finds, determines, and declares that this Ordinance is promulgated under the general police power of the City of Black Hawk, that it is promulgated for the health, safety, and welfare of the public, and that this Ordinance is necessary for the preservation of health and safety and for the protection of public convenience and welfare. The City Council further determines that the Ordinance bears a rational relation to the proper legislative object sought to be attained.


Section 3. Severability. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, or part of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall for any reason be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction invalid, such judgment shall not affect application to other persons or circumstances.

Section 4. Effective Date. The City Clerk is directed to post the Ordinance as required by the Charter. This Ordinance shall become effective upon posting by the City Clerk.
